

### Okotoks Town recognizes Métis Week and Louis Riel Day.

Okotoks Town Council has proclaimed that the third week of November will be recognized annually as "Métis Week" in Okotoks. This year, it will be November 12 to 18, and include Louis Riel Day on November 16. This dedicated week acknowledges and celebrates the Métis people and their culture, history and achievements. Métis people are often referred to as the "Children of the fur Trade," emerging in the early 1700s as a distinct people with their own culture, language and socio-political practices. Today, the Métis people play an important role in the founding and development of our social, cultural and political landscape.

The Métis Nation flag will be raised at the Okotoks Municipal Centre on Sunday, November 12 to mark the beginning of Métis Week in Canada; the flag will remain raised until November 18. The Municipal Centre building lights will also be illuminated in blue from November 12 to 16. Although there will not be a public ceremony for the flag raising, there will be two opportunities to honour and learn about Métis people and culture on November 16.

# Louis Riel Day and Métis Blessing – Rotary Performing Arts Centre (RPAC), November 16, 9:30-10:30 a.m.

The Town will honour Louis Riel Day as a part of Métis Week with a Métis Blessing led by Métis Knowledge Keeper and Elder, Ila Vivier. This public event will also include opening remarks from an Okotoks Elected Official and the District Captain of the Otipemisiwak Métis Government (OMG) of the Métis Nation within Alberta Rocky View District #4, Amber Boyd. 
### Sunday, November 19th, 2023 Twenty-fifth Sunday after Pentecost

#### Readings

JUDGES 4:1-7; PSALM 123; 1 THESSALONIANS 5:1-11; MATTHEW 25:14-30

#### **Second Reading**

A READING FROM THE FIRST LETTER OF PAUL TO THE THESSALONIANS Now concerning the times and the seasons, brothers and sisters, you do not need to have anything written to you. For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. When they say, "There is peace and security," then sudden destruction will come upon them, as labour pains come upon a pregnant woman, and there will be no escape! But you, beloved, are not in darkness, for that day to surprise you like a thief; for you are all children of light and children of the day; we are not of the night or of darkness. So then let us not fall asleep as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober; for those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who are drunk get drunk at night. But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, and put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation. For God has destined us not for wrath but for obtaining salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep we may live with him. Therefore encourage one another and build up each other, as indeed you are doing. 1 THESSALONIANS 5:1-1



### Gospel. The Parable of the Talents


Jesus said, "For it is as if a man, going on a journey, summoned his slaves and entrusted his property to them; to one he gave five talents, to another two, to another one, to each according to his ability. Then he went away. The one who had received the five talents went off at once and traded with them, and made five more talents. In the same way, the one who had the two talents made two more talents. But the one who had received the one talent went off and dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money. After a long time the master of those slaves came and settled accounts with them. Then the one who had received the five talents came forward, bringing five more talents, saying, 'Master, you handed over to me five talents; see, I have made five more talents.' His master said to him, 'Well done, good and trustworthy slave; you have been trustworthy in a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master.' And the one with the two talents also came forward, saying, 'Master, you handed over to me two talents; see, I have made two more talents.' His master said to him, 'Well done, good and trustworthy slave; you have been trustworthy in a few things, I will put you in charge of many things; enter into the joy of your master.' Then the one who had received the one talent also came forward, saying, 'Master, I knew that you were a harsh man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you did not scatter seed; so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here you have what is yours.' But his master replied, 'You wicked and lazy slave! You knew, did you, that I reap where I did not sow, and gather where I did not scatter? Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have received what was my own with interest. So take the talent from him, and give it to the one with the ten talents. For to all those who have, more will be given, and they will have an abundance; but from those who have nothing, even what they have will be taken away. As for this worthless slave, throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth."

MATTHEW 25:14-30

There is also a universal application to all mankind. From the time of the creation of mankind, each individual has been entrusted with resources of time and material wealth. Everything we have comes from God and belongs to Him. We are responsible for using those resources so that they increase in value. As Christians, we have additionally the most valuable resource of all – the Word of God. 
